**On June 1, 2016, certain medications may cost you more unless you take action.**

Express Scripts will manage your prescription plan for UHA Health Insurance beginning June 1, 2016.

Express Scripts helps make safe and effective medications available for you. We continually review and compare medications, including new drugs and generics. As a result, some safe and effective drugs become “preferred” and others may become “nonpreferred.”

**Beginning June 1, 2016**, certain medications you take will become nonpreferred (visit <https://uhahealth.com/express-scripts> for a list of preferred medications). If you fill a prescription for a nonpreferred drug after June 1, 2016, you may have a higher copayment.

### How can you lower your drug costs?

If you are taking a drug that will be classified as nonpreferred on June 1, 2016, talk with your doctor to see if one of the preferred medications is right for you. It could save you money and it’s easy to start.

#### **Go to a retail pharmacy for a 30-day supply**

Ask your doctor to write you a new 30-day prescription or call it in to your local pharmacy.


OR

#### **Have a 90-day supply delivered to you**

If you’d like the medication sent to you, just have your doctor prescribe a 90-day supply to the Express Scripts Pharmacy<sup>SM</sup>.

Don’t wait until your medication runs out or you could pay more. Check your drug list and talk with your doctor.
